

1) Major Function of SI-100 Server

SI-100 Server enables to operate the system in overall with a program for the system control.

- Management of sound source, time alarm reservation broadcasting and management
- Display of individual and Group zone broadcasting control and broadcasting status
- Broadcasting monitoring and source monitoring
- Volume control for each audio input source
- SP-100 status information in each zone
- System and SP-100 Log information
- CD, DECK TUNER equipment control using DIGI-link
- SI-100 Client, web download function provided

2) Major function of SI-100 Client

SI-100 Client is a program for remotely controlling the SI-100, and enables for users to remotely operate the system in overall by accessing to the SI-100 Server via Ethernet network.

- Remote control using Ethernet communication
- Time alarm reservation broadcasting and management
- Volume control for each audio input source
- SP-100 status information for each zone
- Display of individual and group zone broadcasting control and broadcasting status
- CD, DECK TUNER equipment control using DIGI-link



## SI-100 SERVER

This is a program to operate the system setting and overall operation and manages all controls and information of the system. This program is basically installed at the dedicated SI-100. Do not remove, install and remove program. If user's optional removal, reinstallation of program is required, contact the sale agent sold the product.



### 1) Description of every part of screen




1. Selection field of sound source input (Ex: CD, DECK, TUNER ETC)

2) Icon type

Select status: Displays that relevant zone is selected as MP3.



In-broadcasting select : Displays that MP3 source is selected at the zone where CDP is broadcast. CDP continues to broadcast until [Start] or [End] will be pressed.

3) All zone select and release




- Used for selecting all zones at the system.
- Press the button at the **All** bottom of the Mini Map screen.
- Press the **Clear** button to release Selection of All zone.

4) Select and release of all zones on the screen


- Used to select all 20 zones on the screen.
- Press the **This All** button on the zone select and status display part.
- Press the **This Clear** button to release the zone Select.

5) Select of individual zone

- Used for selecting some of 20 zones on the screen.
- Select zone after selecting input source.



6) Select of group zone




- Uses several zones together.
- Setting of a group cannot be optionally changed by user.
- Press the button of desiring group name to select zone belonged to the Group.
- Press **Group A** or **Group B** button to change the Group.

7) Broadcasting start

Ex) To broadcast a CDP to the Zone 1




- Select the CDP from the input source select on the end of screen.
- Press **Start** button after selecting the zone to send broadcasting.



8) Broadcasting off

Ex) To end broadcasting to the Zone 1

- Press **End** button after selecting the Zone 1.



9) MP3 play



- The play control window appears if pressing MP3 once again after selecting it from the input source select on the upper part.



- Press the  button to play after selecting a file to play.
- If pressing the  button, play stops.

10) MP3 play mode select

- Able to select general play and optional play mode for playing MP3.
- Select  if desiring to play to the play list order.
- Select  if desiring to play to random order irrespectively of the play list order.

11) MP3 repeat mode select

- Able to repeatedly play music for playing MP3.
- Select  if playing music currently selected once without repeat.
- Select  if continuing to play music currently selected.
- Select  if playing all music repeatedly. to random order irrespectively of the play list order.

12) New MP3 file add

- Able to add sound source not existed in the list.
- If pressing the **ADD** button, the Sound Source Add window appears.



- Press the **ADD** button after selecting the file to add.
- Press the **External Files** button to bring in files not stored in SI-100. If pressing the **ADD** button after selecting a file, the file is copied and added to the SI-100.
- Up to 20 files per time can be added.

※ **Caution** : The MP3 (MPEG Audio Layer-3) is one of audio compression technologies defined in the MPEG. Normal MP3 has value of Layer 3 in the inner information of a file. However, some files may have file with value other than Layer3 in inner information in spite of MP3 file. This can be directly checked by the user. Such files may appear in the file list. If any file does not appear in the list, modify it to normal MP3 file for use by re-encoding.

13) CD-ROM play

- Music CD can be played using the CD-ROM Driver mounted.



- The Play Control window appears if pressing CD-ROM once again from the Input Source Select at the top.



- Press the  button to play after selecting a track to play.
- Play stops if pressing the  button.
- ※ **Caution** : Broadcasting using a CD-ROM is available for only general audio CD, and files of MP3, WMA and OGG are not supported.

14) Emergency MIC broadcasting (broadcasting by selecting zone)

- Enable to perform Emergency MIC broadcasting by selecting some zones.
- Select  from the Input Source Select.



- Broadcasting is ended if turning off the TALK Key in the end of broadcasting after selecting zone to broadcast and broadcasting while the TALK key at the right side of SM-100 pressed.

15) Zone monitoring.


- Able to monitor broadcastings of the zone currently broadcast.
- Press the  button at the right side of SM-100.
- If selecting the zone to monitor, the zone icon changes to monitoring status to monitor with a speaker.



16) Change of broadcasting BUS.

- This system is a system to provide 6-way function. The sound source of the bus already in broadcasting may be changed to a new sound source by selection, if desiring to transmit other BGM broadcasting in the status that being using 6 all busses.

Ex) Where 6 different sound sources are currently in broadcasting in the 6 zones and if desiring to transmit new broadcasting to other zones




- Status that all busses are used since different broadcastings are performed at 6 zones as in above figure.
- Message window pops up as follow if desiring to broadcast different new BGM to 'Zone 7' in this case.



- Press the 'Yes' button to end broadcasting of other bus currently broadcasting and replace with a new bus.



- Status of all the busses currently broadcast appears.
- For example, select **BUS 4** to end broadcasting of PT9107 'sound source in the BUS 4' and replace with a sound source.
- Not able to select the bus that higher priority of broadcasting than BGM is selected.



- Press the 'Yes' button to apply a new sound source to the selected bus.



- As in above figure, sound source of the existing 'PT9107' in the bus 4 was changed to MP3 Files'.  
 - If selection of the bus to change is completed, press the  button to apply.



- It is found that broadcasting of Zone 4, that broadcasting of 'PT9107' sound source is output, is completed and that a new 'MP3 Files' sound source is applied to Zone 7.


### 17) SYSTEM LOCK function



- Lock function is supported to prohibit a person other than designated uses to operate the unit. If pressing and holding the [Main] button at the right upper part for 2 seconds, the mode is converted to Lock Status. If the mode is converted to Lock Status, the Lock Display flickers at the end of the screen.
- To release the lock function, input passwords while pressing the lock display flickering.

2) Description of external sound source equipment control screen

- Basic Panel: Displayed for equipment that DIGI-link is not controlled.



- CDP Panel: Supports Repeat / Play / Pause / Stop function.



-  CD Disk Change : Change disk for the CD Changer. Disk numbers actually applied are displayed on the screen for the CD-660/CDC-6600. Other CD Changers may differ from the actually applied disk.
-  Repeat Play : Changes Repeat Mode of the CD player.
-  Random Play : Changes the Random Play Mode of the CD player.
-  Previous music : Moves to the previous music.
-  Play : Plays the CD player.
-  Pause : Pauses the CD player.
-  Stop : Stops play of the CD player
-  Next music : Moves to next music
-  Set : Applies input CD track number. For example, if pressing this button after selecting No.1 track, No.1 track is played.
-  Clear : Clears input CD track number.

- DECK Panel: Supports REWIND / STOP / PLAY / FF function.




-  Wind backward : Rewind tape in reverse.
-  Play : Plays a DECK.
-  Stop : Stops to play a DECK.
-  Fast winding : Fast wind tape to play direction.

- TUNER Panel: Supports AM / FM function.



-  FM : Changes band of a tuner to FM band.
-  AM : Changes band of tuner to AM band.

### 3) Control of external sound source equipment



Ex) To play No.1 track of a CDP

- Select source to control from the Input Source.



- Press the '1' button if the control screen is come from the CDP.

- Press button if desiring track is displayed.

### 4) Input source monitoring

Ex) CDP monitoring



- Select a CDP from the Input Source.

- Press the Monitoring Button to monitor a CDP with a speaker.

### 5) Input volume adjust

Ex) MP3 play volume control





2) Reservation add


Ex) Add reservation item to Thursday

- Select weekday by pressing the **THU** button.
- It is found that a new item is added if pressing the **ADD** button.



- Modify/input details according to 3) through 8) process if item is added.

- 3) Convert to reservation modify mode  
 - Select items to modify.



- Changed to Modify Mode if selecting the selected item once again.
- Time, zone and sound source can be input in the Modify Mode status.
- Input modify contents according to the process of 'Start Time Input', 'Zone Select', and 'Sound Source Select'.

- 4) Start time input



Ex) AM 10:00 input

- Select start 'time column' from the Modify Mode status.

- Sequentially press the  →  →  →

- Input time by press  button.

※ **Caution** : Input time by the interval of 24 time.

- 5) Zone select

Ex) Select of Zone 1

- Select the zone to send broadcasting in Reservation Broadcasting in the Modify Mode status.

- Select so that pattern is  Zone1 formed by pressing  Zone1 button.

- 6) Select zone from group

Ex) Select of Group 1

- Zone belonged to specific group in the Modify Mode status.

- Group Select window appears if pressing  button.

- Check that zone belonged to the whole group of Group 1 is checked by pressing the  Group1

- If pressing  button, the relevant zone is applied and the window is closed.

7) Sound source select



- The Sound Source Select window appears if selecting the 'Source' column in the Modify Mode status.
- If the Sound Source Select window appears, select a file to use as Reservation Sound Source.



- Press the **SET** button after selecting a file.
- If desiring to add a new sound source, add in the same manner as '12)New MP3 file add' in page 14 by pressing the **ADD** button.

8) Modify contents store

- If all reservation contents to be modified are input, complete modify by pressing the **SET** button.
- Modify work is not applied where sound source is not selected or error occurs in time input.

9) Reservation contents copy

- Ex) Copy Thursday List and paste it to Saturday
- Used when desiring to apply contents of specific weekday to even other weekdays.
  - Press the **COPY** button to copy after selecting the original weekday by pressing the **THU** button.
  - Press the **PASTE** button to paste after selecting the relevant weekday by pressing the **SAT** button.

10) Reservation contents store

- If all reservation setting works are completed, store reservations.
- Press the **Set Schedule** button to store reservations.



##### 2) Check status of SP-100

- Normal status

 : Displays that the relevant channel of SP-100 is in normal status.

- Channel Fault status

 : Displays that status of the relevant channel of SP-100 is in normal status.

- Non-setting/No response status

 : Displays that the relevant channel of SP-100 is set as channel not used, or communication occurs on the main screen since there is not response from SP-100.

## SI-100 CLIENT

This is program to remotely control the SI-100 Server by performing a TCP/IP access using an Ethernet network to the SI-100 Server which is program for overall operation of the system. Since most of functions are same as SI-100 Server, refer to the previous [SI-100 Server]. In this chapter, special matters in installation and function of the SI-100 Client program are only described.

### 1. BEFORE INSTALLING PROGRAM

SI-100 Client is installed in general computers as specified in the [Software Requirements] to use. This computer should have a LAN port and method to connect is as follow:

[Method to Connect]

- LAN port: Connection to a hub connected to Ethernet network
- If connection is completed, input IP, Netmask, Gateway, Wins etc from the network setting of the Windows OS so that the relevant computer can perform Ethernet communication function.


※ **Caution** : Since the SI-100 Client program connects to the SI-100 Server via Ethernet network, program is not driven where Ethernet setting of the relevant computer is not normal.

### 2. PROGRAM INSTALLATION/REMOVE

SI-100 Client enables to install a network via Ethernet network as follow:




#### 1) Download

- Following download page appears if inputting IP of the SI-100 Server in the Address Window after executing Internet Explorer of Windows:
- Download the 'SI-100 Client Setup.exe' file by clicking the [Program Download].



- If executing downloaded file, compression is automatically unpacked and the 'SI-100 Client' Installation Start screen appears.


- Installation work is processed if pressing the [Next] button on the Installation Start screen.



- If installation work is completed, the Installation End screen appears and installation is completed if pressing the [Finish] button.
- If program is properly installed, the 'SI-100 Client' icon is created on the ground screen. Double-click the icon to execute the program.

2) Remove


- If executing the [Program Add/Remove] on the control panel, 'SI-100 Client' is displayed on the list as in following figure:




- Remove Start screen appears if pressing the [Remove] button in the right after selection the 'SI-100 Client' from the list.



- If selecting [Yes], remove work is progressed.




- If remove work is completed, the Remove Complete screen appears and if pressing the [Finish] button, removal is completed.



### 3. BEFORE USE

SI-100 Client has same function as the SI-100 Server except for some including synchronization function and menu etc.

#### 1) Synchronization



If the IP Input window appears, input IP of the SI-100 Server and try to access to the SI-100 Server. If access is not properly done, program is automatically ended. In this case, re-install program according to contents of the [program installation] or recheck the network setting. If access is properly done, replacement for various setting information broadcasting status is done by synchronization with the SI-100 Server. Time required for synchronization work may differ depending on capacity of files that replacement is done and the Ethernet network status in the site.

#### 2) Main screen (control menu)

If synchronization work is completed, same main screen as SI-100 Server appears, and menu to control the screen is additionally generated in the right.



1. Operation Mode: Displays the main screen.
2. Sound Source Equipment Control: Able to control volume and operation of input source.
3. Reservation Set: Able to set reservation broadcasting.
4. System Status Check: Able to check status of each SP-100.
5. Program Complete: Completes SI-100 Client program.

#### 4. SPECIAL REMARKS

##### 1) MP3 player

SI-100 Client does not support function to add sound source and delete sound source that are supported by a MP3 Player of the SI-100 Server.
